## MANUAL HANDLING

Statistics show that neck and back injuries make up more than 30% of all lost time injuries on construction sites.

WorkSafe WA have developed a new Code of Practice for manual handling and all employers should implement the Code in the workplace.

In addition, we should also encourage employers to:

□ □ Ensure all workers are trained in the risks of manual handling.

 $\Box$   $\Box$  Assess awkward loads and work areas and implement adequate controls prior to commencing the lift.

□ □ Use mechanical lifting methods where ever possible.

 $\Box$   $\Box$  Coordinated two man lifts.

□ □ Where possible use 20 kilo cement bags.

□ □ Reduce the size of blocks to less than 20 kilos or use mechanical lifting devices on blocks weighing 20 kilos or more.

□ □ Reduce the size of gyprock and plasterboard sheets or use mechanical lifting devices.

□ □ Reduce the size of formwork sheets or use mechanical lifting devices.

□ □ Ensure manual handling is assessed in your Safe Work Method Statement (SWMS)
